SEESAW

This term we will be reducing and then stopping the use of text messages and using your Seesaw accounts to send messages to parents. **Please ensure you have switched on your notifications for the Seesaw app on your phone to ensure you always know when a new message or your child’s work post has been sent.** Currently our text message service only allows us to send to one parent but both parents can have access to Seesaw, which will ensure both parents get the messages.

HEADLICE

Now we back together again, please remember to check your children's hair and all members of the family for head lice on a regularly basis and treat if live lice are found.

Checking for head lice shouldn't be considered a big deal; it is just a normal part of a family's personal hygiene routine like brushing teeth or washing hair.

- It is best to check for head lice using a comb made for the purpose, ideally white so they can be easily seen and with teeth no more than 0.3mm apart in order to trap head lice
- Combing through the hair when wet, or after applying a conditioner, may make the process more comfortable
- Good lighting is important and so is comfort

Treatment should only be applied if a living, moving louse is found – never 'just in case'

GOOD EYESIGHT

1 in 5 children in the UK are living with an undiagnosed vision problem that can impact their learning and development.

Good eyesight is crucial. Around 80% of what is taught at school is presented visually.

Signs for you to look out for include: straining the eyes or tilting the head to see better, frequent eye rubbing, losing their place when they are reading, sensitivity to light, complaining of headaches or tired eyes, a turn in the eye or misdirection of the eyes, sitting too close to the TV or book, avoiding activities that require either near vision (reading) or distant vision (sports), or closing one eye to watch the TV or to read.

It's never too early to get children's vision checked. Early diagnosis is key.

Eye tests are FREE for children under the age of 16 and if glasses are needed than you will receive an NHS optical voucher to pay for them.
